The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows what to do if she has a concern about the welfare of a child. She understands how to keep children safe and undertakes regular assessments of the environment to help her minimise hazards.
- The childminder knows how to help children develop a healthy lifestyle.
- The childminder understands the need for working in partnership with parents to help support children's individual needs. She is aware of how to seek professional support for children, should they need it, and is familiar with a range of strategies that will promote children's positive behaviour.
- The childminder demonstrates her understanding of how to create challenging activities and has a range of resources to meet the learning needs of children.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and is able to demonstrate how she will use the views of parents and children to identify any future improvements to her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
