Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder describes how she keeps an up-to-date knowledge of childcare practices. She demonstrates she has a secure understanding of protecting children from harm and neglect and the reporting procedures she must follow.
- The childminder demonstrates how she works in partnership with parents. She describes how she supports children's development by making suggestions to parents about how they can support their child's learning at home.
- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She describes how she supports children's development through the seven areas of learning.
- The childminder discusses how she tracks and monitors children's development. She describes how she uses this information to identify what children need to do next to make progress in their learning.
- The childminder discusses how she supports children's overall health and their understanding of the benefits of being active. She describes how she plans fun activities outdoors in her garden and the local community.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
