Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the importance of continuing to evaluate her practice to identify priorities for improvement. For example, she reflects on whether she is offering children enough choice. She updates toys regularly. They remain interesting to children.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how to safeguard children. She understands how to identify children at risk of harm. She knows how to correctly record and report concerns to appropriate agencies quickly to keep children safe.
- The childminder fully understands the need to form links with staff at other settings children attend. She recognises the need to develop a joined-up approach to the sharing of information about children's care and development.
- The childminder understands the importance of promoting positive behaviour. She knows that children respond well when there are clear boundaries in place and this helps children develop a sense of security.
- The childminder has an understanding of how to continue to develop her skills. For instance, she knows how to access teaching resources.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

■ The inspector had a tour of the areas children play in when they are present at the setting.

- The inspector talked to the childminder about her knowledge of safeguarding and checked the safeguarding information available to parents.
- The inspector looked at training certificates and spoke to the childminder about her knowledge of the early years.
- The inspector viewed the toys available to children and talked to the childminder about how she plans suitable activities for children.
