The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has an appropriate understanding of how to safeguard children from possible abuse or neglect. She is clear about the procedures she must implement should she feel a child is at risk.
- The childminder has all required documentation in place.
- The childminder holds a current paediatric first-aid certificate and public-liability insurance.
- The childminder described how she intends to assess children's progress, plan for their future learning and prepare them for their eventual move on to school.
- The childminder explained how she maintains a suitable, safe and secure environment. She has a suitable range of resources, toys and equipment.
- The childminder intends to seek the views of children and parents to help evaluate her setting.
- The childminder explained how she intends to teach children about healthy eating, good hygiene practices and the importance of fresh air and exercise.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
