Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- Managers and staff are dedicated to providing the best quality care and support for children and their families. Staff are supervised and supported in their work and encouraged to undertake continual professional development.
- Staff are highly experienced, enthusiastic and motivated. They are very knowledgeable about child development and how to promote learning, including positive behaviour.
- The nursery provides a very welcoming, stimulating and homely environment for children. It is extremely well resourced. Excellent attention is paid to maintaining the health and safety of all who attend the provision.
- Effective systems are in place to monitor children's progress to ensure that any gaps in learning are identified and addressed.
- The nursery works very closely with parents, partners and healthcare professionals to evaluate the provision and to promote outcomes for children in their care.
- Managers and staff are trained in child protection. They work closely with partner agencies to safeguard children and promote their welfare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
