## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a sound knowledge of child protection procedures. She fully understands her responsibility to identify and respond to any concerns about a child's welfare and how to keep them safe.
- The childminder understands how to offer children a variety of learning experiences and how to develop children's independence, to help prepare them for school.
- The childminder knows how to observe, monitor and assess children when they start, and to continue to assess their learning and plan for their future progress.
- The childminder knows how to develop partnerships with parents. She knows to request information about their child, share progress and include parents in their child's learning.
- The childminder understands how to help children learn to treat others with respect. She acknowledges the importance of providing an inclusive environment to help all children to feel happy and secure.
- The childminder understands the importance of developing her professional practice.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The childminder checked the childminder's understanding of how to work in partnership with parents to meet children's individual needs.
- The inspector checked the childminder is meeting the early years foundation stage requirements.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about self-evaluation and sampled documentation available, including the first-aid certificate.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding and how to keep children safe in her home and on outings.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises that will be available to children.
