## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision does not meet requirements

- Staff do not have a secure understanding of safeguarding. They are not clear on where to report their concerns or what to do if they have a concern about the behaviour of another adult. Staff do not gather enough details from parents to support children's ongoing health needs or gain prior permission to administer medicines. They fail to keep details of injuries children sustain in their care.
- The provider does not monitor the provision effectively to identify and address all weaknesses. They fail to provide staff with effective supervision to improve their personal effectiveness or to meet children's individual care needs.
- Staff know the importance of planning an interesting range of activities. There is a suitable range of resources and the play spaces are welcoming and safe.
- Staff provide healthy snacks and promote healthy lifestyles, such as outdoor games. They understand how to support younger children's behaviour and how to supervise them to ensure their safety. The provider responds to parental concerns, including those raised about the security of the premises. The entrance is now secure.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To meet the requirements of the early years foundation stage and the Childcare Register the provider must:

- The inspector spoke to parents and staff. She held a meeting with the area manager and headteacher of the host school.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used when providing care for the children.
