The provision meets requirements

- The childminder aims to continue to evaluate the overall quality of her provision on a regular basis. She intends to gather the views of others and use this information to help her to identify further areas of improvement.
- The childminder plans to continue to attend training courses and complete regular research regarding ways to enhance her teaching skills.
- Through discussion, the childminder exhibits a good understanding of safeguarding issues. She demonstrates a good understanding of local safeguarding procedures and how to keep children safe through a secure and inclusive environment.
- The childminder discusses ways she intends to use information gained through observations and assessments to help identify what children need to learn next. She has a wide range of resources available that she intends to provide for children.
- The childminder explains that she aims to gather information from parents when children first start the setting. Furthermore, she intends to continue to promote home learning and a consistent approach to managing children's behaviour effectively.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
