- The childminder explains how she manages children's behaviour positively and understands the importance of helping them to learn to respect each other's views.
- The childminder knows how to ensure her home is a safe and welcoming environment where children have access to a range of resources and learning opportunities.
- The childminder recognises the importance of continually developing her skills and knowledge and reflecting on her practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation as a means to drive improvement in the quality of her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
