Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands safeguarding procedures and regularly refreshes her training. She knows the signs and symptoms that would cause her concern.
- The childminder knows how to plan and provide a range of activities. She knows how to use observations and assessments to help develop children's future learning.
- The childminder has a range of resources available to support children in her care which covers all areas of learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnerships with parents. She knows to provide parents with regular feedback about children's learning and care.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children to be independent, have good personal care skills and behaviour, and to value and respect others.
- The childminder understands the importance of teaching children how to be healthy, such as by taking part in physical activity, developing healthy eating habits and following good hygiene practices.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her service.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed the areas of the home that the childminder would use when caring for children.
- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of safeguarding and the welfare requirements.
- The inspector had discussions with the childminder about her knowledge and understanding of the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector sampled a range of documents, including policies and procedures and suitability checks.

The childminder registered in 2013 and lives on the outskirts of Rugby city centre. She operates all year round from 8am to 6pm, Monday to Friday, except for bank holidays and family holidays.
