The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She demonstrates a secure understanding of how to provide activities and resources that interest children and support their next steps in learning.
- The childminder has a good understanding of the possible signs and symptoms of abuse. She knows whom to contact if she is concerned about a child's welfare.
- The childminder demonstrates an appropriate understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. She discusses a range of appropriate positive behaviour management strategies, which she intends to use in partnership with parents.
- The childminder demonstrates how she reflects on her practice to help her to continually improve. She discusses how she works in partnership with other professionals to support this process.
- The childminder explains how she promotes children's health and well-being. She discusses how she intends to give children regular opportunities for developing their physical skills at local parks and activity centres.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
