The provision meets requirements

- The experienced and qualified childminder understands the importance of assessing children's progress and using the information gathered to plan activities that build on what children know and helps to prepare them for school. She makes learning fun.
- The childminder has a robust knowledge of current safeguarding requirements, such as the 'Prevent' duty guidance. She confidently describes the signs that would cause her to be concerned about a child's welfare. She has a clear understanding of how to keep the learning environment safe and promotes children's good health, she knows how to assess and minimise risks to children in her home.
- The childminder understands the importance of strong partnerships with parents and other providers to ensure the best possible outcomes for children.
- The childminder demonstrates a secure knowledge of the importance of supporting children's physical and emotional well-being. She promotes positive behaviour.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice. She knows how to identify areas of weakness and set targets for improvement. She accesses training.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
