## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows the importance of reflecting on her practice and completing training to keep her practice up to date.
- The childminder understands the significance of working closely with parents and other settings the children may attend, to provide a shared approach to children's learning and care.
- The childminder understands the importance of providing an inclusive environment. She plans to teach the children to value their differences, understand their feelings, share and be kind. She will also help children to learn about a healthy lifestyle.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation.
