Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The management team has addressed the actions and recommendations raised at the last inspection. The manager demonstrates up-to-date knowledge of child protection matters, including the procedures for allegations made against staff. The manager understands the need to evaluate the service and bring about improvements.
- The manager demonstrates how she will supervise and train staff to support them in their role and help raise the standards of care for children.
- The manager shows sufficient understanding of suitable behaviour management strategies to use with children and how to encourage positive behaviour.
- The manager knows how to reduce potential hazards to promote children's safety. She describes how she will support children's health and well-being.
- The manager recognises the importance of building effective partnerships with parents and the schools children attend to meet children's needs and support continuity of care.
- The manager demonstrates that she knows how to provide activities that will support children's play and learning experiences.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector went on a tour of the club with the manager and discussed safety procedures.
- The inspector spoke to the manager about the practices and procedures, including safeguarding arrangements.
- The inspector looked at samples of documentation, including the safeguarding and behaviour management procedures, training certificates and public liability insurance.

Ascension Play Holiday Play School registered in 1999. The setting is situated in Cundy Park, Custom House in the London Borough of Newham. The club opens Monday to Friday from 3.15pm until 6.30pm during term time. It also opens Monday to Friday from 8am to 6.30pm during half-terms, Easter and the summer holidays. The provider employs four members of staff, three of whom hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
