The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has systems in place for observing and assessing children's learning and development. She understands how she can support children of different age groups and help them to make progress.
- The childminder understands how to keep children safe and protect them from harm. She knows what to do if she has a concern about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder knows how to manage children's behaviour and understands her role in helping children to respect and value others.
- The childminder has a good understanding of how to promote children's health. She recognises the importance of good hygiene and will provide regular opportunities for children to develop their physical skills in the fresh air.
- The childminder understands the need for working in partnership with parents and other settings that children attend to support children's individual needs.
- The childminder reflects on her practice and has attended a range of training to help develop her skills and knowledge.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
