## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to assess children's progress and use the information to plan activities that build on their learning and prepare them for school.
- The childminder understands the need to work closely with other early years settings. For example, she is aware of the value of providing activities that complement what children are learning elsewhere.
- The childminder keeps up to date, for example, by doing research and training. She has updated her safeguarding training and understands her role in reporting child protection concerns to the relevant agency.
- The childminder knows how to teach children about the importance of exercise and healthy eating.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of working closely with parents to meet children's welfare needs and provide continuity of care.
- The childminder knows how to teach children to respect others and behave appropriately.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector checked safety in the areas of the home that are used for childminding.
- The inspector discussed childcare practices with the childminder.
- The inspector sampled relevant documents that the childminder uses when she is childminding.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of how to meet the learning and development requirements.
- The inspector checked the childminder's understanding of safeguarding procedures.
