## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a very good understanding of safeguarding. She knows how to assess and reduce the risk for children when they are with her. She is aware of what steps to take if she has concerns about children's welfare to keep them safe.
- The childminder knows how to reflect on her practice and identify areas to improve.
- The childminder works closely with other childminders and pre-school settings and attends formal training to stay up to date with changes in practice and new legislation.
- The childminder has a very strong understanding of child development. She has a good range of toys and activities ready to support children's learning and physical skills.
- Systems to observe, assess and monitor children's development are ready for the childminder to use. She fully understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other settings to provide consistency in children's development.
- The childminder knows how to help children prepare for school. She knows how to promote positive behaviour, respect and tolerance and support children's healthy lifestyles.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector looked at a wide range of documentation, including children's records and the childminder's training certificates.
- The inspector had a tour of the setting and checked the home was safe for children.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder in relation to how she would support children's learning and development and how she kept her knowledge and skills up to date.
