Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her responsibilities for keeping children safe and protecting their welfare. She knows the procedures to take should she have concerns about a child in her care and has a clear allegations management policy in place.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge and understanding about how children learn. She understands the importance of making regular observations of children's learning to track progress and monitor any emerging gaps in their development.
- The childminder understands the importance of self-evaluation and reflection. She has identified areas for future development to promote children's positive outcomes.
- The childminder is aware of the impact of positive partnerships with parents and other early years providers on children's learning. Procedures are in place to support these and aid children's ongoing development.
- The childminder has considered her ongoing professional development and has identified courses to support children's future learning and skills.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
