## **Summary of key findings for parents**

### This provision is good

- Children enter the club happily and make good friendships. Staff greet parents and children each day. They ensure parents register children's attendance. Children separate well from their parents and choose what they want to play with.
- Staff plan activities that take place indoors and outside effectively. Parents access information online about the club.
- Staff ensure children are supervised well throughout the day.
- Children behave well. Staff successfully promote positive behaviour and are good role models. Older children involve younger children well in games, such as dodgeball and football.
- Parents speak highly of the club. They state they are very happy with the range of activities their children enjoy and the enthusiasm of the staff. They feel assured that their children are being well cared for and remain safe.

## It is not yet outstanding because:

- Staff do not consistently help children to understand how good hygiene promotes their good health.
- Staff do not always ensure that there are sufficient activities available for children who may arrive at different times during the day.

# What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

- help children to understand how their good hygiene promotes their good health
- make sure that there are sufficient activities for children who arrive at differing times during the day.

#### **Inspection activities**

- The inspector observed the quality of staff interaction during activities indoors and outdoors and assessed the impact this has on children's enjoyment and achievement.
- The inspector spoke to staff and children at appropriate times during the inspection.
- The inspector observed an activity with the manager.
- The inspector met with the manager and a senior manager and looked at relevant documentation and discussed processes for self-evaluation.
- The inspector spoke to parents during the inspection and took account of their views.

# **Inspection findings**

### Effectiveness of the leadership and management is good

The arrangements for safeguarding are effective. Staff are knowledgeable of the signs that may indicate children are at risk from harm and neglect. They understand the local safeguarding referral procedures. Recruitment procedures are secure and systems for monitoring staff's performance are continually developing through the introduction of supervision and peer observations. These, alongside professional development opportunities, enhance staff's performance. Staff frequently meet together to plan and evaluate the activities. Children's safety is a priority. Staff take effective steps to minimise potential hazards within the environment. Up-to-date policies and procedures inform parents about the service provided and reflect the club's ethos of high-quality care effectively.

## Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Children make choices throughout the day. Resources are plentiful and children share and take turns through play. For example, children learn to share electronic equipment and games so that all of them have opportunities to play. Children enjoy being creative and use a wide range of materials. They follow simple instructions, for example, while making their own baskets with card. Staff encourage children to recognise different colours and shapes during activities. Children show good dexterity using small tools, such as pencils, crayons and scissors. These also support children to use their left or right hand, whichever is preferred. Younger children enjoy role play and re-enact familiar experiences. They spend time caring for the dolls and use buggies to take them for walks. Children show high levels of concentration as they use construction materials. For example, children enjoy creating their own models and they add wheels to make them move across the floor.

## Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Staff encourage parents to share as much information as possible about their child to ensure their needs are met effectively throughout the day. Children show through their behaviour that they feel safe and secure in the club. Staff and children talk each day about expectations, safety and the evacuation procedure in the event of an emergency. Children access fresh drinking water throughout the day and parents provide packed lunches each day. Staff ensure they are fully informed of any dietary and medical needs. Children benefit from plenty of fresh air and exercise and engage in a wide variety of activities outdoors, including mission impossible and den building. Staff praise children's good behaviour and recognise their efforts and achievements. They build children's self-esteem and confidence well. Children learn about different traditions and celebrations throughout the year, supporting their awareness of diversity and the wider world.
