Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has risk assessment procedures to provide a safe environment for children. She understands her responsibilities for safeguarding children and is clear about the procedures to follow in the event of a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of reviewing and improving the service she provides. She attends mandatory training and keeps her knowledge up to date.
- The childminder understands how to observe, assess and plan children's learning experiences to help them progress and develop further.
- The childminder knows how to support children's personal development and manage their own feelings and behaviour.
- The childminder understands how to work in partnership with parents and other early years settings to share information and to support consistency of children's learning.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of supporting children's health and well-being. She has arrangements to enable children to enjoy fresh air and exercise, and to teach them appropriate hygiene routines.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
