Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider has a clear vision for maintaining high standards at the club. He is proactive in assessing how to promote continuous improvement. The provider understands the importance of making sure staff are well supported in their roles.
- The provider and staff know how to plan activities and offer a wide variety of resources for children's play. They recognise the importance of working in partnership with the host school and with parents to complement children's learning experiences elsewhere.
- Staff understand the signs when a child may be at risk of harm and the procedures to follow if they have a concern about a child's welfare. There are clear procedures in place for staff recruitment, supervision and training.
- The provider and staff understand the importance of supporting children's good health and offering active play opportunities inside and out. Staff plan to promote children's emotional well-being and good behaviour, and help them form secure attachments.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector discussed with staff how they deliver the safeguarding and welfare requirements and checked evidence relating to the suitability of staff.
- The inspector sampled some of the setting's policies and procedures, and discussed these with the staff and the provider.
