The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates an extremely good knowledge of how to observe and assess children's progress in all areas of learning. She can plan appropriate resources and activities to stimulate and develop children's curiosity to learn. She knows how to monitor children so that any gaps in their progress can be quickly addressed.
- The childminder is fully aware of her responsibilities to effectively safeguard children and protect them from harm. She ensures her house and garden are suitable for children to play safely.
- The childminder knows how to evaluate her practice. She is keen to identify where she can make future improvements and updates her training.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents and other professionals to provide continuity of care and learning. She explains how she will share key information with parents, including policies and procedures.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of how children develop their social and personal skills, and how to promote their positive behaviour and self-confidence.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
