## Summary of key findings for parents

## This provision is outstanding

- The inspirational manager has embedded exceptional evaluative systems. She incisively gathers the views of others to help her scrutinise the overall quality of the setting. The manager has made significant developments since the previous inspection. Children have even further opportunities to enhance their excellent exploratory skills.
- Parents are extremely complimentary of the highly dedicated staff team. They are provided with excellent opportunities to contribute to their children's learning. Parents complete extensive information about their child prior to starting at the setting. This helps staff to gain a thorough understanding of children's individual needs and interests.
- Children thrive in this inspiring setting. They are highly motivated to learn. Children fully immerse themselves in superb pretend scenarios. They use large toy construction vehicles, bicycles and scooters. Children create their own pretend car wash, using buckets, sponges and soapy water. This helps to promote children's imaginations.
- Staff encourage children to participate in discussions regarding healthy options. Children learn where food comes from and talk about their recent experience of growing vegetables. This helps children to enhance their understanding of the natural world.
- The manager astutely analyses children's progress, including progress made by groups of children. She is fully committed to providing sharply focused action plans to help all children make the best possible progress. Children make rapid progress.

# What the setting needs to do to improve further

#### To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

■ refine the excellent opportunities for children who speak English as an additional language to further experience their home language while at the setting.

# **Inspection findings**

### Effectiveness of the leadership and management is outstanding

Safeguarding is effective. The highly conscientious manager and staff team demonstrate a superb understanding of local safeguarding policies. They have an exceptional understanding of signs and symptoms of abuse and follow meticulous safe working practices. The manager provides extremely effective supervision sessions that help to embed first-rate teaching practices. She completes rigorous practice observations that help her to very precisely target professional development needs. The highly qualified staff continuously review their own learning. They have created exceptionally inviting areas to help very effectively promote children's communication skills. Staff intend to evaluate the impact on children's learning through providing even further enticing opportunities for children to use their home language during play.

### Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is outstanding

The very highly qualified staff team fully engages children in all areas of learning. They provide superb interactions and use high-quality questions that help children to think about what might happen next. Staff encourage children to use an extensive range of materials to extend their creative play, including pretending to bake cakes for others. Staff use meticulous observations and extremely accurate assessments to plan enthralling activities based on children's interests. Staff have excellent working relationships with other professionals involved with children's learning and development needs. They use meticulous action plans that help to expertly address children's individual needs.

#### Personal development, behaviour and welfare are outstanding

Children are very confident. They demonstrate excellent social skills and behave very well. They play harmoniously with one another and show high levels of respect. Children demonstrate excellent hygiene practices. They independently use tissues to blow their nose and remember to wash their hands. Children have excellent opportunities to participate in physical activity. They delight in joining in with exciting action songs and learn to move their bodies in various ways. Staff provide children with high levels of praise and encouragement. They fully celebrate children's individual achievements. This helps to promote children's self-esteem.

#### **Outcomes for children are outstanding**

Children make excellent progress. They demonstrate superb levels of independence as they pretend to buy shoes from the shoe shop and try different ones on. Children talk about how much the shoes cost as they pretend to purchase them and use mathematical language in their play. They pretend to take notes and talk about the marks they make. This helps to very effectively promote children's literacy skills. Children are superbly equipped with the key skills needed for future learning and the eventual move to school.
