- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other providers children attend, to work together consistently to support children's learning and development.
- The childminder knows how to plan her environment and activities to help children make progress and prepare them for school. She understands her responsibilities to monitor children's development and ensure they receive additional support where needed.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice and seeking parents' feedback to continue to make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
