

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 9 February 2018 we received a notification from the provider about an incident. The notification means that the provider met their legal responsibility as set out in the early years foundation stage welfare requirements to notify Ofsted.

We also received information from a partner agency on 13 February 2018 raising concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. On 6 March 2018 we carried out an unannounced visit. We have issued a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take actions below within the timescales set out.

Make sure appropriate records are kept and information is shared with other professionals working with children. In particular, social services so they have all relevant information to ensure appropriate decisions can be made to meet children's needs and safeguard them.

Make sure managers consider all incidents and follow your own policies and procedures in relation to allegations against staff in order to safeguard children.

Make sure children are supervised appropriately at mealtimes to ensure their safety.

Ensure parents are informed of any injury sustained to their child to ensure

medical treatment can be sought if necessary without delay. Make sure staff complete a written record of accident, injuries and any first aid treatment given.

Ensure confidential staff records are held securely so that only those who have a right to see personal information have access to it.

All actions to be completed by 2 May 2018. An inspection was carried out on 3 May 2018 and all actions were completed.

The provider will be able to give parents further information about this. The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
