The provision meets requirements

- The childminder demonstrates that she has a good understanding of how to protect children in her care. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse and is confident to report concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder explains how information will be shared with parents and other professionals to help ensure children's individual needs are met.
- The childminder discusses the importance of providing children with healthy snacks and regular opportunities to be active outside in the fresh air.
- The childminder is able to demonstrate how she will use observations and assessments to plan interesting and challenging activities to help children progress in their learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of encouraging children to be independent throughout their play and daily routines. She explains how she will help to promote their self-esteem and develop their confidence.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's positive behaviour.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
