Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands her role and responsibility. She uses training opportunities and professional development activities to enhance her knowledge and skills to help ensure that she meets statutory requirements.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's emotional well-being and teach them about expected behaviour, such as respecting others.
- The childminder understands the importance of regular information sharing between her and parents, to provide continuity in children's learning.
- The childminder understands the importance of assessing and monitoring children's individual progress, and of preparing them for the next step in their education. This knowledge includes carrying out the progress check for children when between the ages of two and three years.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge about safeguarding. She is aware of the things that indicate that children are at risk of harm and what procedures to follow to keep them safe.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector and the childminder looked at the areas and resources available for children's use.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder her understanding of the requirements of the early years foundation stage and of other government requirements, and how she intends to meet these when children attend in the future.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children, and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed, and reviewed, the policies and procedures that the childminder will use when caring for children, including the child protection policy.

The childminder registered in 2003. She lives in Kilburn, in the London Borough of Camden. The childminder works Monday to Friday, all year round.
