The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to promote children's care and education and provides a safe and suitable home environment. She has a secure understanding of the safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- The childminder has undertaken training to ensure she knows the signs and symptoms that may indicate harm or neglect and the procedures she should follow if she has concerns about the welfare of a child.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She knows how to assess children's progress well and understands how to motivate children to become independent learners. She uses resources which promote inclusivity and diversity, teaches children about cultural festivals and attends activities in the community when caring for children.
- The childminder knows that establishing and maintaining a good relationship with parents is important and has effective systems to ensure regular communication with them.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
