The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how to use assessment and planning processes to promote children's learning and to help them develop skills in readiness for school.
- The childminder has experience of caring for children who have special educational needs and/or disabilities and children who speak English as an additional language.
- The childminder understands her responsibilities to safeguard children. She ensures that she and her assistant regularly update their safeguarding training to keep children safe.
- The childminder conducts thorough risk assessments of her premises and outdoor areas. She teaches children how to keep themselves safe during journeys to and from school and during their play.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents. She shares information with them about their children's learning and the activities she provides. She obtains the views of parents and children to help her to make improvements when she evaluates her setting.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

The childminder works with another registered childminder and one assistant. She holds qualified teacher status.
