Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is aware of the importance of building strong relationships with parents from the start, enabling them to work in partnership to support children's wellbeing. She knows this helps children to settle quickly in her care and form secure attachments.
- The childminder demonstrates a suitable awareness of safeguarding issues. She is aware of child protection procedures and recognises the possible signs that children may be at risk of harm. The childminder intends to make sure her home is safe and will complete thorough risk assessments of her home.
- The childminder has a suitable understanding of the range of ways in which she can educate children about healthy lifestyles.
- The childminder understands the requirements of the early years foundation stage. She discusses how she intends to provide a wide range of activities and resources to support children's learning and development effectively.
- The childminder demonstrates her understanding of how to manage children's behaviour. She discusses a range of behaviour management strategies she will use.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration the suitability checks.
