## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision is good

- The manager and senior management team work hard to ensure activities are inclusive and tailored to meet children's individual needs and interests.
- Staff have developed good partnerships with parents, who speak highly about the provision. They explain that they find staff approachable and friendly, and that they are kept well-informed about the activities available.
- Children enjoy keeping active and using the outdoor play area. They make up games to play with their friends and ensure everyone is included. Children enjoy taking manageable risks, under the close supervision of staff.
- Children are very happy, confident and feel at ease. They enjoy accessing a wide variety of activities which supports their learning and development.

### It is not yet outstanding because:

- Occasionally the management team does not identify all aspects of the setting which would benefit from further monitoring and improvement.

## What the setting needs to do to improve further

### To further improve the quality of the early years provision the provider should:

- build upon current self-evaluation processes to further enhance how areas of improvement are identified and monitored.

### Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the setting, indoors and outside. She spoke to the senior management team, manager and staff at appropriate times.
- The inspector observed activities and care routines and interacted with the children.
- The inspector spoke to a small number of parents and took account of their views.
- The inspector reviewed a sample of documentation and records.
- The inspector carried out a joint observation with the manager.

## Inspection findings

### Effectiveness of the leadership and management is good

Safeguarding is effective. Staff are vigilant about children's safety and ensure they supervise them very well. They have attended relevant training in child protection issues and fully understand the procedures to follow if they have concerns. Staff are supported well in their development, including through regular mentoring visits from the area manager. Parents are encouraged to share their views about the setting and senior managers are keen to continue to develop and enhance the provision. Recent improvements include reorganising snack times, which now provide more opportunities for children to serve themselves a range of healthy and nutritious food before sitting together in small groups where they chat and socialise. The manager recognises the benefits of developing partnerships with others who work with the children, such as staff at the school and other professionals. This helps to maintain consistency of the care and support offered to each child.

### Quality of teaching, learning and assessment is good

Staff act as very good role models. They encourage quieter children to get involved in conversations and activities and ensure children feel settled and secure. Staff talk to the children about what they have been learning about at school and ask challenging questions, which encourages them to think about new ideas and remember past experiences. Children enjoy looking at books with staff. They talk about the pictures and discuss what they think might happen next. Other children enjoy craft activities, such as making a trophy to celebrate a football tournament. Children eagerly respond to challenges, persevering well. When children achieve their goal, they beam with pride and staff enthusiastically praise their efforts.

### Personal development, behaviour and welfare are good

Children are very relaxed and happy in their surroundings. They confidently talk to staff and enjoy playing with their friends. Children show kindness and consideration to others and giggle happily showing they feel safe, respected and secure. Staff encourage children to be independent and they understand how to keep themselves healthy. Children eagerly pour their own drinks, explaining to their friends that water is important for their body. Staff take extra care helping new children settle into the group, such as by finding out key information about their likes and dislikes. As a result, staff get to know children quickly and are able to meet their needs from the start.
