## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- Safeguarding is effective. The childminder understands her responsibilities and knows what to do if she has concerns about a child's well-being or welfare.
- The childminder knows the importance of making observations and assessing individual children's progress and development. She understands how to help them make good progress in all areas of their learning. The childminder has a wide selection of resources.
- The childminder is aware of the importance of supporting children to develop respect for each other and to build good relationships with their friends. She discusses supporting children to be independent and to gain skills that help them to prepare for school.
- The childminder knows how to keep children safe. She ensures her home is free from hazards and that all toys and resources are appropriate for use by children.
- The childminder is aware of the need to evaluate her practice and her setting. She has acted on previous recommendations from her last inspection to make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to meet the safeguarding and welfare requirements when minding children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children.
