## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder knows how to keep children safe. She understands the latest safeguarding legislation and knows what to do if she is concerned about a child's welfare. The childminder understands how to check her home is safe for children.
- The childminder understands how to encourage children to behave well and lead healthy lifestyles. She understands how to promote children's physical development. She knows the importance of teaching children to respect others and value diversity.
- The childminder knows how to work in partnership with parents and other professionals to meet children's learning and welfare needs.
- The childminder understands the importance of evaluating her practice. She knows how to include the views of parents and children in making ongoing plans for improvement.
- The childminder knows how to monitor children's learning. She understands how to use assessment information to plan activities in order to meet children's individual needs. She understands how to check children's progress and address any gaps in their learning.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
