

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework-2.

If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

On 2 May 2018, we received information which raised concerns that this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We issued a welfare requirements notice which requires the provider to:

ensure there is a named deputy who, is capable and qualified to take charge in the manager's absence at all times by 11 June 2018

ensure all staff receive effective induction training to help them understand their roles and responsibilities. Induction training must include information about emergency evacuation procedures, safeguarding, child protection, and health and safety issues

ensure there are appropriate arrangements in place for the supervision of staff so that they receive support, coaching and training that promote the interests of children and which encourages the confidential discussions of sensitive issues

ensure all staff preparing and handling food receive training in food hygiene

ensure staff and children are not exposed to risks and determine where it is helpful to make some written risk assessments in relation to specific issues, to inform staff practice, and to demonstrate how risks are managed and how the risk will be removed or minimised.

On 11 June 2018, we conducted an unannounced monitoring visit to the setting to assess compliance with the welfare requirement notices. We found the provider had taken appropriate action to ensure all requirements were met. The provider will be able to give parents further information about action they have taken.

The provider is still registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
