## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to provide enjoyable and challenging experiences for children. The environment is organised well with the needs of children in mind. The childminder has effective systems in place to monitor children's progress, and understands the importance of using observation and assessment to help children achieve.
- The childminder understands the safeguarding policies and procedures. There are effective systems in place to secure the safety, welfare and well-being of children.
- The childminder has effective systems in place to keep parents up to date about their children's care and achievements. She understands the importance of working with parents to help close any gaps in children's learning.
- The childminder has a secure understanding of how to teach children to respect each other and behave well.
- The childminder adopts a reflective approach and understands how to evaluate her practice to ensure standards are maintained and practice developed.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector viewed all areas that are used when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to support children's play, learning and care.
- The inspector discussed with the childminder the policies, procedures and documents the childminder will use when caring for children.
