Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder has not maintained a current paediatric first-aid certificate as required. This is a breach of requirements in the Early Years Register and the Childcare Register.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of child protection issues. She has a confident knowledge of how to identify and report any concerns she may have about a child's safety or welfare.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour. She knows that praise and encouragement help to develop their self-esteem and confidence.
- The childminder has a secure knowledge of how to assess children's development. She knows how children learn through play and understands how to monitor their progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other early years settings to support children's care and learning.
- The childminder understands the benefits of reflecting on her practice to help her make improvements.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
