The provision meets requirements

- The childminder is confident with the signs that indicate abuse or neglect. She knows how to report any concerns to the relevant agencies to protect children's welfare.
- The childminder understands how children learn. She observes, assesses and monitors children's development to plan activities that help build on their progress over time.
- The childminder reflects on her practice. For example, she make changes to her policies in response to information she receives from the local authority, to bring them in line with changing legislation. The childminder meets with other childminders and they share good practice.
- The childminder understands the importance of working closely with parents to share what children know and can do, for a consistent approach to their learning.
- The childminder knows how to support children to build a positive self-esteem and develop confidence. She understands how to help children manage their behaviour, to respect their friends and get along with each other.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
