Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The provider has a sound knowledge and understanding of how to promote children's safety and welfare. She understands her role and responsibilities and ensures that all committee members have received suitability checks with Ofsted.
- The manager and her staff demonstrate a good knowledge of child protection procedures and understand their responsibility to protect the welfare of children in their care.
- The manager demonstrates that she has a good knowledge of positive methods to use to effectively manage children's behaviour.
- The manager and staff have a sound understanding of how to provide children with interesting activities that complement the learning children receive in school.
- The manager understands how to evaluate the effectiveness of the club. She knows to gather the views of parents and children to help identify ongoing improvements.
- The manager demonstrates her understanding of how to provide children with nutritious snacks and opportunities to be physically active.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector toured the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the manager and viewed documentation that she plans to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the manager, staff and provider and took into consideration the suitability checks.
- The inspector looked at relevant documentation, such as staff's training certificates.

Redwood Kids Holiday Club registered in 2000. The club employs seven members of childcare staff. Of these, one holds an appropriate early years qualification at level 3 and one member of staff holds qualified teacher status. The club opens from Monday to Friday after school. Sessions are from 3.05pm until 6pm. The club also offers a breakfast club from 7.45am until 8.50am. The club runs every half-term holiday, one week at Easter and the first three weeks of the summer holidays. During these periods, sessions are from 8.30am until 5.30pm. The club is closed during the Christmas holidays.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
