# Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands how young children learn and knows how to support their development. She recognises ways to monitor children's progress.
- The childminder comprehends ways to work with parents to ensure continuity for the children. This includes involving parents in children's learning and listening to their input about what their children can do and what they are interested in.
- The childminder knows how to support children in their personal and emotional development. She discusses confidently the ways that she helps them to develop independence and social skills in preparation for changes to busier settings.
- The childminder understands how to evaluate her practice. She actively develops her professional knowledge and skills to help her make improvements.
- The childminder has a confident knowledge of safeguarding. She understands the signs that may indicate a child's welfare is at risk and knows what to do if she has concerns. The childminder ensures her knowledge of safeguarding is up to date. She discusses more-recent legislation in depth and relates it to her provision.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children.
