Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- Staff do not understand how to manage children's challenging behaviour appropriately. They do not deploy themselves effectively to supervise children.
- The provider does not monitor the provision effectively to identify and address all weaknesses. They fail to provide staff with effective supervisions to improve their personal effectiveness or to help them support children's behaviour sufficiently.
- Staff understand the importance of working in partnership with parents and other professionals. They maintain records and share information swiftly where necessary to safeguard children. The provider understands how to address complaints sufficiently.
- Staff are clear on how to identify signs that a child is at risk of harm, including extreme views. They understand the procedures to follow if they need to report a concern about a child or the behaviour of another adult.
- Staff understand how to plan for children's learning and development. They know how to adapt their teaching to meet the learning needs of children, including those who have special educational needs (SEN) and/or disabilities.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further

Challengers Basingstoke Playscheme registered in 2016. It is located in Basingstoke, Hampshire. It operates from school premises with access to outside space. It is open Monday to Friday from 9.30am to 4pm for two weeks during the Easter holidays and four weeks during the summer holidays. It also opens on Saturdays from 9.30am to 4pm, during term time only. The setting primarily offers care for children who have SEN and/or disabilities. The club employs seven staff members, including one who holds qualified teacher status. Several staff hold recognised childcare or health and social care qualifications and a number have specialist qualifications or experience working with children who have SEN and/or disabilities.

This inspection was carried out by Ofsted under sections 49 and 50 of the Childcare Act 2006 on the quality and standards of provision that is registered on the Early Years Register. The registered person must ensure that this provision complies with the statutory framework for children's learning, development and care, known as the early years foundation stage.
