## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The manager understands how to evaluate the club and takes into consideration feedback from staff, parents and children. She knows how to provide development opportunities for staff to enhance their knowledge and skills.
- The manager and staff have knowledge of safeguarding and child protection issues. They are familiar with the procedures to report any concerns about a child's welfare, including allegations.
- The manager recognises the importance of working with parents to share information about the club's routines and procedures to make them aware of what to expect.
- The manager and staff know how to plan indoor and outside opportunities for children to explore to keep them engaged and to provide learning experiences at the club.
- The manager and staff understand how to support children to develop their personal and social skills. They know how to provide opportunities to develop children's health and physical well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## **Inspection activities**

- The inspector discussed with the manager how they intend to provide activities and experiences that support children's learning.
- The inspector looked at the club's policies and documents she intends to use when caring for children.
- The inspector discussed with the manager her processes for self-evaluation and the club's improvement plan.
- The inspector viewed resources and had a tour of the areas of the premises used by children of the breakfast and after-school club.

The Moadon registered in 2016. The breakfast club operates Monday to Friday from 8am to 8.40am and the after-school club opens Monday to Thursday from 3.15pm to 6pm. The club employs six staff, including the manager who holds qualified teacher status.
