This inspection

The effectiveness of the home and the progress and experiences of children and young people since the most recent full inspection

At this inspection the service was not judged.

Lambourne End Centre was registered as a holiday scheme for disabled children in August 2016. During the registration process, the registered manager and the responsible individual were assessed as suitable.

As the Lambourne End residential holiday scheme has not operated since registration, and no children have received a short break, it has not been possible to conduct an inspection of the scheme in action.

The residential holiday scheme may operate at any premises defined by the scheme as safe and suitable. It was therefore agreed that the inspection would consist of a telephone interview with the registered manager, but with no judgement made.

The local authority is currently considering its commissioning priorities in children's services, and opportunities to tender will arise shortly. Plans for any future holiday schemes at this centre will depend on the management team making a successful bid for funding.

In the event that the management team is successful in tendering for a contract, the registered manager is aware of his responsibilities to ensure that the scheme is well planned, and properly staffed and organised.

The registered manager confirmed that no children have received a short holiday break through this scheme. The registered manager has confirmed that the service will not be operational until at least June 2018. The registered manager is aware of the requirement to inform Ofsted of any impending schemes for the following year, and will report back on any progress in May 2018.

The proposed holiday scheme will take place at Lambourne End Centre. This is an established centre where the focus is on outdoor activities and learning being made available to all children.
