## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The experienced childminder demonstrates an excellent knowledge of child development. She has a wide range of quality games and books to meet the interests of children.
- The childminder has a very thorough understanding of safeguarding procedures. She understands how to keep her suitable home and garden safe, and how to get additional support if she has any concerns about children's welfare or emotional well-being.
- The childminder is aware of the benefits of having extremely good relationships with the local school and other professionals to help promote continuity in care and learning.
- The childminder has high expectations of children's behaviour. She is aware of how to be a good role model to support children to develop cooperative play, respect and tolerance.
- The childminder has developed a good range of strategies to keep parents informed and to promote partnerships with them.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

## Inspection activities

- The inspector had a tour of the setting to see where children would play and observe how effectively the provider risk assesses to provide a safe environment for the children.
- The inspector looked at a wide range of documentation, including children's records and the childminder's training certificates.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder in relation to how she supported children's learning and development and how she kept her knowledge and skills up to date.
- The inspector held discussions with the childminder in relation to her duties for safeguarding and child protection.
