## Summary of key findings for parents

### The provision meets requirements

- The childminder understands the learning and development requirements. She is able to demonstrate how she will use observations and assessments to plan activities to help children progress in their learning.
- The childminder demonstrates an understanding of child protection issues. She is aware of the signs and symptoms of abuse and is confident to report concerns to the relevant authorities.
- The childminder knows how to encourage children to maintain a healthy lifestyle. She explains that she provides children with daily opportunities for fresh air and exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other professionals to meet children's individual needs and future learning.
- The childminder understands how to manage children's behaviour. She knows how to teach children to respect each other.
- The childminder recognises the need to evaluate her provision. She understands the importance of updating her skills and knowledge to help improve outcomes for children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.
