Summary of key findings for parents

The provision meets requirements

- The childminder has made improvements since the last inspection. Furthermore, she knows the importance of effective self-evaluation to improve outcomes for children.
- The childminder has clear policies and procedures in place to safeguard children. She is aware of the correct procedures to follow if she has a concern about a child's welfare.
- The childminder understands the importance of carrying out risk assessments to ensure the premises are safe and suitable for children to play and learn.
- The childminder knows how to use information from observations and assessments of children's learning. She intends to plan activities that include children's interests and what they need to learn next. She shows a secure understanding of the required progress check for children aged between two and three years.
- The childminder understands how to promote children's health and well-being. She plans to provide nutritious meals and regular opportunities for children to exercise.
- The childminder understands the importance of working with parents and other professionals who may be involved in the care of children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector discussed with the childminder how she intends to deliver the educational programmes for children and undertake observation, assessment and planning.
- The inspector discussed the policies and procedures with the childminder and viewed documentation that she will use when caring for children.
- The inspector viewed the areas of the premises used by children and discussed the equipment and toys available.
- The inspector discussed the safeguarding and welfare requirements with the childminder and took into consideration evidence of suitability checks.
