Summary of key findings for parents

The provision does not meet requirements

- The childminder does not have a clear understanding about the procedures to be followed in the event of an allegation being made against herself or a household member.
- The childminder does not have a sufficient knowledge of the 'Prevent' duty guidance. Her procedures for safeguarding children are not in line with the guidance of the Local Safeguarding Children Board.
- The childminder has a good knowledge of the learning and development requirements. She understands how to plan effectively to meet children's individual learning needs.
- The childminder discusses how she will provide regular opportunities for children to learn about living a healthy lifestyle and develop their physical skills outdoors.
- The childminder demonstrates a good understanding of working in partnerships with parents and other professionals to ensure children's individual care needs are met.
- The childminder understands the importance of forming secure relationships with children to support their emotional well-being.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

What the setting needs to do to improve further
