

Compliance action taken for childcare provision

Summary of outcome

All early years providers must meet the legal requirements in the 'Statutory framework for the early years foundation stage', which you can find at www.gov.uk/government/publications/early-years-foundation-stage-framework--2. If we find that a provider is not meeting the requirements, we can take action to ensure they put matters right.

We inspected this provider on 9 July 2018. We found this provider was not meeting some of these requirements. We have served a Welfare Requirements Notice. This is a legal notice that requires the provider to take the actions below within the timescales set out. The provider will be able to give parents further information about this.

Actions needed

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ensure unauthorised persons cannot enter the premises and that doors are secured at all times, by 6 August 2018

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implement effective systems to ensure that any person caring for, or in regular contact with children is suitable, which must include obtaining a Disclosure and Barring Service check, by 6 August 2018

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ensure that staffing arrangements are effective in meeting the individual needs of all children, by 6 August 2018

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ensure all staff have an up-to-date knowledge of safeguarding issues, including the 'Prevent' duty so that they are able to take action if they have any concerns about a child's well-being, by 6 August 2018

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maintain an accurate daily record of the names and hours of attendance of all children being cared for on the premises, by 6 August 2018

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put arrangements in place for the effective supervision of all staff, to support and enable them to continually improve their practice and personal effectiveness and offer quality teaching experiences for children , by 6 August 2018

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ensure the key-person system is effective and tailored to meet each child's individual needs, and builds good relationships with parents to implement a targeted programme of support for those children with gaps in their learning, by 6 August 2018

We visited this provider on 9 August 2018 to monitor the welfare requirements notice. We

found that they had met the actions to improve staff knowledge and understanding of the Prevent Duty, key person, quality of teaching, security of building and DBS. However, they had not met the action that required them to maintain accurate records of attendance. As a result we have re-issued this action.

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maintain an accurate daily record of the names and hours of attendance of all children being cared for on the premises, by 15 August 2018

We visited this provider on 16 August 2018 to monitor the re-issued welfare requirements notice and found the provider had taken appropriate action. There is no further action for Ofsted to take. The provider remains registered with Ofsted.

Publication of compliance action

We aim to ensure that the welfare of children and young people is protected in the services we regulate. The Childcare Act 2006 and accompanying regulations set out our responsibilities to regulate childminders and childcare providers. This includes the enforcement powers we have in relation to those registered providers who do not comply with the requirements for registration.

We publish details of any actions we take, or the childminder or childcare provider takes to bring about compliance with requirements on our website for a period of five years commencing on the date we complete our investigation.
