The manager regularly updates staff knowledge about the appropriate procedures to follow in the event of any such concern.
- The manager understands the importance of establishing partnerships with the schools that children attend to provide them with a range of experiences that complements their school experiences.
- The manager knows how to support staff in continuing their professional development. She knows how to help them meet the requirements of their role.
- The manager understands how to carry out self-evaluation to identify areas to strengthen. She knows how to use parents' and children's views to target improvements.
- The manager knows how to promote children's emotional and physical well-being. She knows the importance of children following good hygiene practices and eating healthy food. The manager knows how to use the key-person system to help children settle well and develop positive relationships.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Crazy 4 Kids Malcolm Arnold registered in 2017. The club employs seven members of childcare staff, three of whom hold appropriate early years qualifications at level 3 or above. The club opens Monday to Friday during school term times and during school holidays. Term-time sessions are from 7.30am to 8.30am and from 3pm to 6pm. The holiday club runs from 7.30am to 6.30pm daily.
