Summary of key findings for parents

This provision meets requirements

- The childminder keeps her knowledge in safeguarding and child protection up to date. She knows what to do, and whom to contact, in the event of a concern.
- The childminder holds a current first-aid qualification. She is experienced in completing daily safety checks of the premises to minimise any potential risks or hazards.
- The childminder continues to use information from training, research and other professionals to help her evaluate and improve her practice.
- The childminder knows how to plan for children's individual needs, complete assessments of children's learning and development, and monitor their progress.
- The childminder understands the importance of working in partnership with parents and other early years settings to promote children's well-being and learning.
- The childminder has clear policies and procedures to support children's well-being. She has a secure understanding of how to promote healthy lifestyles and positive, confident behaviour in children.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

Inspection activities

- The inspector sampled the childminder's documentation, including policies, suitability checks and training certificates.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's knowledge and experience of safeguarding and child protection procedures.
- The inspector viewed the premises with the childminder and talked with the older children present about their experiences.
- The inspector talked with the childminder about her experience working with children.
- The inspector took account of the views of parents from information provided in their letters.

The childminder registered in 2011. She lives in Andover, Hampshire. The childminder mostly cares for children aged four and over, before and after school and during the holidays. She holds an appropriate qualification at level 3.
