## Summary of key findings for parents

### This provision meets requirements

- The childminder has a good understanding of safeguarding and how to keep children safe. She discusses how to gather information from parents to support children's health and well-being.
- The childminder describes the key areas of learning. She demonstrates how she plans activities to help support children's communication and language skills. The childminder demonstrates how she provides children with a wide range of activities to promote their understanding of different cultures in the wider community.
- The childminder recognises the importance of supporting children's good behaviour.
- The childminder describes how she creates opportunities for communication, language and understanding of numbers to help children to be ready for the next stage of their learning, including starting school.
- The childminder continues her professional development. She understands the importance of regularly evaluating her practice to maintain the quality of her childcare.

There were no children present when this inspection took place. The findings in this report are based on evidence gathered from discussions with those who care for the children and an inspection of the premises, equipment and relevant documentation. Where there are no children present, no judgement is made on the quality of the early years provision as there is no reliable evidence on which to assess its impact on children. The report states whether the provider continues to meet the requirements of registration.

- The inspector reviewed documents, including policies and procedures.
- The inspector discussed the childminder's understanding of safeguarding and her systems to keep children safe.
- The inspector observed the premises and reviewed the resources on offer to children.
